Remarks of the Grand Parliamentarian

Richard Ashby, General Grand Chapter Committee Member – Benevolence and Grand Parliamentarian

Good morning, Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron thank you for allowing me to become Parliamentarian again this year. I have been up here many times that everybody knows myself by now. I was asked a number of questions this year regarding abstentions. I always like to give some different information every year and dispel some myths.

According to Robert's Rules of Order: "The chair should not call for abstentions in taking a vote, since the number of members who respond to such a call is meaningless. To "abstain" means not to vote at all." The Chair should call "Those voting for the motion ..." Those opposed ..." Then announce the result. That's all. When you are the Chair - Do Not call for abstentions as they are meaningless and have zero effect.

There are limited cases where it is either prudent or <u>required</u> for individuals not to participate in a show of hands or a roll call vote. One is the Chair: The Chair has an obligation to maintain neutrality at all times, and participation in a vote does demonstrate a partiality. **Two**: A member should not vote on a question in which they have a direct personal interest or financial advantage not common to other members of the organization. And finally, Three: Parliamentarian. As Parliamentarian, for more than 25 years now have voluntarily given up my right to participate in any show of hands vote, because, I absolute impartiality. Like the Chair, I do, however, must and do maintain participate in the ballot vote process for officers as that vote is a secret ballot, and neutrality due to that secret ballot is never in question.

Members DO have the right to abstain from voting, but it is important that they know the impact of that abstention. **Basically, nothing. No effect at all.** Abstaining from voting has no impact whatsoever. However, that is different for the Chair. The Chair does have the right to vote to make or to break a tie vote. The Chair must consider very carefully in such circumstances if the significance of the motion is of such importance that the duty of impartiality of the office should be violated. The consequences can be monumental.

As far as members are concerned, for them to abstain is absolutely meaningless in the determination of the vote. To take this to the extreme as a legitimate example, if there are 100 members present, and the Chair calls for the vote on a motion; 3 people vote for the motion, and 1 person votes against the motion, with 96 members abstaining, **the motion still passes**. Since the rule is that a majority of the members present, and voting is required for adoption.

3 voted for the motion, 1 against the motion for a total of 4 votes cast. The motion

is adopted by a majority of those who voted - 3 people.

Just as a note: aside from a conflict of interest, the rule on abstaining from voting on a question of direct personal interest does not mean that a member should not vote for himself for an office. If the member does not want to hold an office, they would never have volunteered or accepted the nomination. In another situation, when other members are included with that member in a motion, for example, voting for members of a committee, there is no need for a member to abstain. If a member never voted on a question affecting herself or himself, it would be impossible for society to vote to hold a banquet as such action affects every member.

Please members: Remember that abstentions are meaningless. They are NOT a protest against the motion, they are NOT expressing disapproval, they mean ABSOLUTELY NOTHING other than you have wasted your time, and perhaps have reneged on your obligation as a member.

As a chair think back to this talk and just call for those for and those against and call it quits. Thanks.

Jacquie Charlton, WGM

Believe you me for all of those line officers, when you ask Richard a question it's amazing what he gives you in answers and it's very helpful so use him because he is there for you, and we hope that he is going to still stay on.

Sister Donna Richard, would you come to the East and give your report on the scrutineers.

That's from the Red Book page fifty, not my words. The interpretation of this is we are to help provide support mostly financial to Belmont House. This has been the focus of my term to help raise house. For many of us being so far funds to support our from Washington, D.C. it is difficult to for us to even imagine Belmont House, what our house is actually like. Videos and photos help us to see the beauty and splendor housed there. That being said we need to remember it is mansion and requires consistent maintenance. Money raised from an older our committee has been used to put new solar film on the windows and to replace defunct air conditioning units. We have had some of the floors refinished with material that does not require as much maintenance SO costs of labour and materials for cleaning is reduced. We have just received refinishing of some chairs e-mail this past week asking for approval for the in the house at the request of the Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Glenda Winchester. Photos were included with this request and believe me those chairs

were really awful. I'm so glad that we were able to help with their refinishing. Twenty-eight windows have rotting frames and we're paying to have them replaced.

Initially, each member of the General Grand Chapter was asked to provide one dollar per year of the Triennium towards the support of the house. Letters were sent out to all chapters and money was sent in to the General Grand Chapter Committee Member in their area and then it was to be forwarded positively. I can only hope the rest of Canada have forwarded their funds to the Right Worthy Grand Secretary. Our funds will be sent June 30th. 2024.

Now Saskatchewan has sent in a total of \$1177.00 and had one hundred percent involvement from the members of the Saskatchewan Grand Chapter. Thank you so much for your support of this project and thank you to Sister Thea Howe, General Grand Chapter Committee Member – International Headquarters for her dedication to this project. British Columbia and Yukon did not have a General Grand Chapter Committee Member – so it was my responsibility to collect for them. They have donated \$874.00 and my sincere thanks to all the chapters who have sent support to this project.

Alberta has shown great support and has sent \$2828.00 for the project with about seventy-five percent of our chapters participating. Thank you one and all.

A grand total of \$5438.00 has been raised by our three jurisdiction and this will be forwarded to the Right Worthy Grand Secretary. I collected two hundred dollars by selling candy bags and pins so it will be \$5,600. If you or your chapter has not had a chance to support this project you have until June 30 to do so. There are pins and candy bags available at the back table. The pins were designed for our project and the candy bags, and the poppy pins are a small way of helping to offset the exchange that we're going to be facing at the end of June.

- 1. Q: What is the procedure to reinstate a member who has been suspended for non-payment of dues?
 - A: As per the Constitution (pg. 28) "A member who was suspended for non- payment of dues may be restored to membership on written application and by paying the indebtedness according to the bylaws of the Chapter. Once a request has been made in writing, the chapter shall decide by a motion what indebtedness is due.
- **2. Q:** A question in regard to eligibility for a proposed petitioner with a lengthy Masonic background, but no paperwork could be located. With hard work Chapter members, confirmation was received.
 - A: Potential candidate was eligible for membership (Ritual page 163)
- 3. **Q:** A question was raised by a committee under the OES foundation regarding the distribution of funds after their fundraiser. The committee was interested in donating the proceeds to worthwhile charities within the communities where the Chapters were instead of donating to the OES Foundation.

If this notice of Motion is not approved, then this committee will have to follow the membership's decision and the current Constitution.

Thank you, Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, I have been asked to say a few words on Brother Gyulai. Now this all started when my phone displayed a name of Jacquie Charlton. I am getting suspicious of that number.

Dan and I have been friends for over thirty years. Dan came into Masonry in January of 1992, and someplace along the way around there, I met him. In February 1994, he

joined Eastern Star, Maple Leaf Chapter No. 7. He subsequently became Worthy Patron in 1998, 2001, 2005, 2011, 2013 and is the present Worthy Patron of Maple Leaf No.7. I might add this year for Dan it is special honour because Deanna is sitting there at Martha's chair, and she is his daughter.

Dan has also served as District Deputy Grand Master in Chinook Arch District. In 1994, he joined the Scottish Rite and received his thirty-third degree in 2009. He was a member of the Royal Order of Scotland and of course a Shriner. Dan and I have known each other for some thirty years and I think most of you know Dan. From the day I met him he has been just as opposed to haircuts as he is now. We spent some time in Mexico, on our first trip down there Dan explained to me some of the rules of being in Mexico. He told me that you could not have your first libation of the day until the sun was over the yardarm and then he explained to me that in Mexico sun was always over the yardarm.

Dan has been a very dedicated member of Maple Leaf, as he is of all of the other organizations he has belonged to. It is situation where life has interfered that he can not be here today, but in spirit he is here today.

Thank you, Brother Jim. Sister Llynne, would you like to say a few words on behalf of the Service Dog Committee.

Llynne Lambert, General Grand Chapter Committee Member – Chair Service Dogs

Thank you, Worthy Grand Matron, I've got a little puddle over there, I just, water always wanted just to take a moment to look around, this is my follows me around. I just third time speaking in Alberta and my last on Service Dogs. It means a lot to me today to see our Saskatchewan delegation here to support Alberta. My Alberta Chapter celebrating forty years since we started as a charter member, my B.C. family and friends, my way older brother that has never seen me speak. I am a little nervous and you know how you practice what you're going to say in the mirror. I learned years ago when I had my speech on cards, and you 'gotta' do some actions. I am an action person, flipped my cards into the toilet, then I had to blow dry them, so I then went to papers and I never clued in that I should number the papers and as I watched the others come up, I am thinking heaven forbid that I have my notes on the phone or computer, you know what I do with that, I would probably loose them in the toilet. Anyway, I am here to talk a little bit about Service Dogs. When I talk about the dogs, they mean so much too me so I really don't need notes, but rather than go on an on I thought I would try to keep it. I am sorry you're wet over there; we spilt water.

As the Order of the Eastern Star, we advocate for qualified Service Dog Programmes and provide financial assistance to such organizations aiding their efforts to serve mankind and allow individuals to achieve independence.

Now the need is great, and the wait lists can be very long for these service dogs, but we can with your support bring services dogs into the lives of those that need them the most. I just wanted to take a moment today to talk about some of the dogs that Eastern Star has provided to those that need them. Now with the Autism Society that was a wonderful donation that your Chapter has made to autism, but autism with service dogs is dedicated to the need of the children.

Autism as you know is a condition related to the brain development that impacts how a person perceives and socializes with others. Some children with autism might bolt. They just run out, so with a service dog they are usually a larger dog like a lab, so that dog will lay down instantly, it's tethered around the child so that stops the child running into the water, into the traffic. Families with autism children find it hard to take them out into public places because they are terrified to go into the mall or into public washrooms so with a dog that makes it easier for the whole family to go out. It is hard for autistic children to sometimes make friends, they really want to belong, but it is difficult for them so with a dog the other children want to know the dogs name, where you are going, and it just opens that door for those children. They provide a calming relief for so when there is too much going on the dog will sit down/lay the children in the schools, down in the assembly, ride on the school buses and they don't get that anxious moment. These dogs, autism assistant they have the ability to listen not only to the child but to the parent as well, so they listen to two masters.

Now hearing service dogs, they can alert to the doorbells of course, the telephone but most importantly to an emergency like a fire alarm, they can wake that person up. They have also been trained to respond to sign language so if a person with hearing problems can communicate that way with their dogs.

Service dogs are the ones that help people in a wheelchair, they help pick up things, they open doors, and they basically do everything that a human can do but they never argue not once. You can imagine the fear, there was a girl she had a service dog, and she was in a wheelchair and she got stuck on the ice, you know how hard it is to move in a car on ice and she was in a wheel chair, so she could direct her dog to call 911 or go get a neighbour to help her. That was wonderful.

For sight and vision there is a service dog, that was the original programme with guide dogs, and it is still very much in demand.

Medic alert service dogs are for people that are insulin dependent with hypoglycemic unawareness. They don't realize that their sugar is dropping these dogs can retrieve the diabetic kit and food and stay with that person until help comes. Sometimes those dogs are smaller dogs, like a poodle they have the hypoallergenic dogs.

Seizure response dogs are similar to the diabetic, they can react to the onset of a seizure, and they can signal for help. If you see a service dog on its own with its coat and no one around, then it is usually someone is in trouble and that dog is looking for help.

A newer dog we have is the facilities support dog. These are used by agencies for individuals in traumatic situations like first responders are on a scene, they need a

dog there to support the most vulnerable. They are also used in a court cases, those dogs will walk on either side of the person, so if a child was going into an interview or someone going into the witness box, that dog would come between them and maybe somebody they are afraid or nervous of, so it could be on either side. They are now putting dogs with professional agencies in cancer clinics, so if they are going to undergo treatment and it's very traumatic for them, they have a dog that can work in that situation.

Emotional support dogs PTSD and you know that with the BC/Alberta Guide Dog Foundation that is very important to you, to have those dogs for comfort because they can provide support for an invisible disability someone else might not visually see that there is a problem.

Alberta has the distinct honour of being a charter partner of the BC/Alberta Guide Dogs for over twenty years, and we heard from them yesterday how well they are doing, how many dogs they have placed.

I would like to sincerely thank your Alberta Service Dog Committee, Sister Susan MacArthur and her committee, I have worked with her for several years, and also Brother Dan. Thank you, Deanna, for working with us as well, it has been a very meaningful and wonderful relationship that I have had. Well done Alberta on your donations over the years.

Our heroines and thought how similar our mission of Service Dogs also represents our teachings.

Truth – know that which is true and believe in it, see and hear the results of our work with Service Dogs.

Constancy – little by little we will provide one Service Dog at a time.

Loyalty – to our cause and what is our cause to be a better person.

Faith – faith that what we strive to do we will do, to our best and to trust in God to do the rest.

And Love – let us be like our Service Dog a best friend offering unconditional love to one and other and to our fellow men.

Thank you, Sisters and Brothers, for your continued support of our charity and helping Canadians with disability receive a life changing dog. It's truly remarkable and I thank you Sisters and Brothers, it has been an honor to speak on Service Dogs. It is an easy job because you love it some much and to see the results.

Thank you, Worthy Grand Matron, for the honor of speaking.

So, I would like to call on Brother Tim Cameron the Chair of Finance Committee and Brother Hector van Vierssen Trip to come forward for your Finance Committee Report.

Tim Cameron, PGP

Morning Sisters and Brothers. We'll just get Brother Hector up here, because quite honestly, he is really the genius behind all of the Committee. I am sure that he has some supplementals that he wants to add, everything is printed in the books starting at 13, 14A and B, plus a bunch more.

Hector van Vierssen Trip, PGP

"Excuse the voice." I am getting over a cold but for the finance report it's printed in and Committee Reports which you all received in your registration packets, rather than bore you with reading the whole report. I would like to just highlight a few items in it. The expenditures and income are close to balanced in the General Account, in large part due to the excellent work of the Expense Review Committee, with a little help on the income side from increases in interest and dividend rates. There will be no need to increase the per capita fee of ten dollars per member. Our market value in equities at the end of 2023 was \$119,00.00 more than the original investments. Total assets held in cash and GIC's were 53% at the end of 2023, which is comfortably above the minimum 50% mandated in our Constitution. The OES Foundation spent almost forty-three thousand dollars on donations in 2023, plus \$34,500.00 from the Casino Account. Chapter, Vesper and district tea donations totalled over \$12,000.00, and this was augmented by over \$30,000.00 from the investment account. A final comment, eleven of the fifteen equities in our portfolio increased their dividend payouts in 2023 and most have done this consistently over the past ten years. In 2012 the general account investment income was \$9,300.00 and in 2023 it exceeded \$17,000.00. As long our investment continues to increase annually, we will remain solvent regardless of the market value fluctuations in particular year and we should be able to leave the Grand Chapter annual per capita charge unchanged at ten dollars per year.

Finance Report for Yearend 2023

Hector van Vierssen Trip

Financial Statements as of December 31, 2023

There are two tables which supplement this report, which show the status of investments as of yearend 2023 for the General Account and Foundation Account. Also attached are the Profit and Loss statements, the Balance Sheets and the auditor's report.

General Account

Cash on hand was \$6,536 as of Dec 31, 2023.

A \$16,495 GIC bearing 1.00% interest matured during the summer, was topped up to \$16,869 and reinvested at 5.05% interest.

Investment income was \$17,115. This includes \$2,370 which is shown as an increase in capital (+\$1,996 in BNS Inv Svgs + \$374 from the abovementioned GIC reinvestment) rather than as investment income on the Profit and Loss statement.

Investment income is expected to be \$17,800 in 2023, due to interest and dividend rate increases.

There was a loss of \$3,641 on Grand Session; expenses of \$32,918 versus income of \$29,276, including \$2,300 from Second Hand Rose and Vendors.

Net operating income for the year was a loss of \$798 (after adjusting for the \$2,370 return of capital), so if Grand Session had broken even, we would have shown a slight profit of +\$2,800.

OES Foundation Account

Cash on hand was \$31,993 as of Dec 31, 2023.

A \$40,073 GIC bearing 3.07% interest matured in April 2023; \$10,000 was returned to cash and the remaining \$30,073 was reinvested at 4.47% interest.

Investment income was \$37,634 in 2023 (including \$3,383 in a compound interest GIC which is shown as an increase in capital rather than interest income on the Profit and Loss statement.)

Investment income is expected to be \$38,200 in 2023 due to dividend rate increases.

The Foundation received \$11,700 in donations in 2023 vs \$14,314 in donations in 2022 and over \$20,000 in 2019, the last pre-COVID year.

Net investment income (interest and dividends less management fees and audit expenses) was \$27,126. The OES Foundation spent \$42,900 on donations in 2023 (plus \$34,500 from the casino account), resulting in a net operating loss of \$4,132. In 2022 it was decided to implement a COVID top-up totalling \$20,000 to keep the Foundation's charitable donations in line with prior (pre-COVID) years. It is recommended that the top-up be \$8,000 in both 2023 and 2024 to keep donations in line with the pre-COVID years.

A final comment: Eleven of the fifteen equities in our portfolio increased their dividend payouts in 2023 and most have done this consistently over the past 10 years. In 2012, the General Account investment income was \$9,300 and in 2023 it exceeded \$17,000. As long as our investment income continues to increase annually, we will remain solvent regardless of the market value fluctuations in any particular year. And we should be able to leave the Grand Chapter annual per capita charge unchanged at \$10 per member.

The OES Foundation spent almost \$43,000.00 on donations in 2023 (plus \$34,500 from the casino account).

INDEPENDENT PRACTITIONER'S REVIEW ENGAGEMENT REPORT

To the Members of The Grand Chapter of Alberta, Order of the Eastern Star

We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of The Grand Chapter of Alberta, Order of the Eastern Star (the Organization) that comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2023, and the statements of revenues and expenditures, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNPO), and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Practitioner's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the accompanying financial statements based on our review. We conducted our review in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements, which require us to comply with relevant ethical requirements.

A review of financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements is a limited assurance engagement. The practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making inquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less in extent than, and vary in nature from, those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on these financial statements.

Basis for Qualified Conclusion

In common with many not-for-profit organizations, the Organization derives revenue from fundraising activities, the completeness of which is not susceptible to us obtaining evidence we considered necessary for the purpose of the review. Accordingly, the evidence obtained of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Organization. Therefore, we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to fundraising revenue, excess of revenues over expenditures, and cash flows from operations for the year ended December 31, 2023, current assets and net assets as at December 31, 2023. Our review conclusion on the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2022 was modified accordingly because of the possible effects of this limitation of scope.

1. NATURE OF OPERATIONS

The Grand Chapter of Alberta, Order of the Eastern Star (the "Organization") is a non-profit organization incorporated under the Alberta legislation (Chapter 99) on May 10, 1973. Its purpose is to grant financial support to charitable organizations. The Organization is exempt from income tax under 149(1)(1) of the Income Tax Act.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of presentation

The financial statements were prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. The financial statements have, in managements opinion, been properly prepared within reasonable limits of materiality and within the framework of the significant accounting policies summarized below:

Revenue recognition

The Grand Chapter of Alberta, Order of the Eastern Star follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions

Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Endowment contributions are recognized as a direct increase in net assets.

Restricted investment income is recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted investment income is recognized as revenue when earned.

Fees and dues are recognized as revenue when the corresponding event is held.

Casino funds are recognized as deferred revenue when received as the amounts are not easily measured and the timing of collection is uncertain. The funds are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred.

Fund accounting

(i) General Fund

The purpose of the general fund is to record the ongoing administrative and operating expenses of the Organization.

(ii) Foundation Fund

The purpose of the foundation fund is to record the donations to various charitable causes which the Organization wishes to support, and the corresponding administrative costs associated with carrying on this activity.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash consists of cash on hand and bank deposits. Highly liquid investments with maturities of one year or less at date of purchase are considered to be cash equivalents. Because of the short-term maturity of these investments, their carrying amount approximates their fair value.

Bank balances that the Organization can not use for operating purposes as they are externally restricted in use are excluded from cash and cash equivalents.

Donated services and materials

The operations of the Organization depend on both the contribution of time by volunteers and donated materials from various sources. The fair value of donated materials and services cannot be reasonably determined and are therefore not reflected in these financial statements.

Financial instruments

Measurement of financial instruments - The entity initially measures its financial assets and liabilities at fair value, except for certain non-arm's length transactions. The entity subsequently measures all its financial assets and financial liabilities at amortized cost, except for investments in equity instruments that are quoted in an active market, which are measured in fair value. Changes in fair value are recognized in net income. Financial assets measured at amortized cost include cash, accounts receivable and term deposits. Financial liabilities measured at amortized cost include accounts payable and accrued liabilities and deferred income.

Impairment - Financial assets measured at cost are tested for impairment only when there are events or indicators of impairment. The amount of the write-down is recognized in net income. Any previously recognized impairment loss may be reversed to the extent of the improvement, provided it is no greater than the original impairment provision. The amount of the reversal is recognized in net income.

Transaction costs - The entity recognizes its transaction costs on the acquisition, sale or issue of financial instruments in net income in the period incurred. However, financial instruments that will not be subsequently measured at fair value are adjusted by the transaction costs that are directly attributable to their origin.

Investments and other non-cash assets

Investments consist of marketable securities and term deposits with original maturities of over one year.

Marketable securities consist of publicly traded securities. Investments for which there are quoted prices in an active market are carried at fair value. Unrealized gains or losses are reported as part of net income. Investments for which there is not an active market are carried at amortized cost except when it is established that their value is impaired. Impairment losses, or reversal of previously recognized impairment losses, are reported as part of net income.

Term deposits consist of Guaranteed Income Certificates (GIC's) and are valued at cost plus accrued interest.

All gains and losses from the sale, collection, or other disposition of investments and other non-cash assets are accounted for in the fund that owned the assets.

Ordinary income from investments, receivables, and similar assets is accounted for in the fund owing the assets, with the exception of income derived from investment of endowment funds. Unrestricted endowment fund investments are accounted for as revenue of the operation fund, or, if they are restricted, as deferred amounts until the terms of the restriction have been met.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Measurement uncertainty

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the period. Such estimates include accounts payable accruals, interest receivable and the valuation of contributed goods and services. Estimates are periodically reviewed and any adjustments necessary are reported in earnings in the period in which they become known. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Inventory

Inventory is valued at the lower of cost and estimated net realizable value with the cost being determined on a specific identification basis. Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

These transactions are in the normal course of operations and are measured at the exchange amount, which is the amount of consideration established and agreed to by the related parties.

14. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Organization is exposed to various risks through its financial instruments and has a comprehensive risk management framework to monitor, evaluate and manage these risks. The following analysis provides information about the Organization's risk exposure and concentration as of December 31, 2023.

(a) Credit risk

Credit risk arises from the potential that a counter party will fail to perform its obligations. The Organization is exposed to credit risk with respect to it's accounts receivable. The accounts receivable are due from reputable members and are subject to normal credit risk. The Organization has a significant number of members which minimizes concentration of credit risk, and therefore the Organization is not exposed to significant credit risk.

(b) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that an entity will encounter difficulty in meeting obligations associated with financial liabilities. The Organization is exposed to this risk mainly in respect of its accounts payable and accrued liabilities.

(c) Currency risk

Currency risk is the risk to the Organization's earnings that arise from fluctuations of foreign exchange rates and the degree of volatility of these rates. The Organization is not exposed to significant foreign currency risk from these financial instruments.

(d) Interest rate risk

Interest rate risk is the risk that the value of a financial instrument might be adversely affected by a change in the interest rates. The Organization is not exposed to significant interest rate risk.

(e) Other price risk

Other price risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices (other than those arising from interest rate risk or currency risk), whether those changes are caused by factors specific to the individual financial instrument or its issuer, or factors affecting all similar financial instruments traded in the market. The Organization is exposed to other price risk through its investment in quoted shares.

Sister Laurinda Parkinson, PM

I first met Donna when I came to Red Deer, looking for a job and I found one at a hearing aid office. Donna had just left that position and I took it, and I didn't know that I was going to be her Sister eventually.

Sister Donna Richard was initiated into Harmony Chapter No. 25 in Stellarton, Nova Scotia, on November 12, 1970, one month before her nineteenth birthday, at their Official Visit. Her Father was then Worthy Patron and her Mother was Adah. Both her Mother and Father held the offices of Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron respectively in Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island. She affiliated with Venus Chapter No. 2 in Red Deer on February 13, 1984, and held dual membership until May 2018 when Harmony Chapter surrendered their charter.

Sister Donna has held many Star Point positions as well as the position of Secretary in Venus Chapter No. 2. She became Worthy Matron in 1990 with Brother Mal Hough, and in 1994 with Brother P.A. (Bud) Lund.

From 1996 to 1997 Sister Donna was Grand Representative of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island in Alberta and was able to attend both their Grand Sessions. In 2000 Sister Donna again assumed the position of Worthy Matron with Worthy Patron Terry Skelton and in 2009 with Worthy Patron Brother Josef Stalter.

In 2010 Sister Donna was elected to the Board of General Purposes for a three-year term. She served only one though, as she became Associate Grand Conductress in 2011, Grand Conductress in 2012 and Associate Grand Matron in 2013. In 2014 Sister Donna was installed as Worthy Grand Matron and presided over the 103rd Grand Session in 2015 – "Sharing a Moment in Time" in the Grand Chapter with Brother Paul Febrey. Sister Donna's Past Grand Matrons pin was created using a combination of her Mothers and Fathers Past Grand Matron and Patron Pins.

On November 11, 2021, Sister Donna was installed, via Zoom, to the position of General Grand Chapter Committee Member – Credentials. A position she has held for the last three years.

I am really pleased to know that she is my Sister.

Jurisprudence Committee

Mary Wescott, PGM

The purpose of the Jurisprudence Committee is to deal with all questions and legal aspects in the operation of the Grand Chapter of Alberta that are referred to by the Worthy Grand Matron.

The function of the Jurisprudence Committee will be to: Assist the Worthy Grand Matron, when necessary and at her request, with questions pertaining to the Ritual, Constitution, Rules and Regulations and any related matters. Be aware that all questions are to be directed to the Worthy Grand Matron who in turn will refer them to the Jurisprudence Committee if, as or when necessary. The Jurisprudence Committee may draw on the expertise's of others/committees before answering or making recommendations to the Worthy Grand Matron. Under no circumstances should questions or requests for advice on these matters be directed to another member prior to referring to the Worthy Grand Matron, who will then refer to the Jurisprudence Committee.

Question: When the AM proves the chapter with members on demit present - does she vouch for one member (as long as all members on demit are from the same closed chapter) and then that member would vouch for the rest of the demitted members?

Answer: Yes, The AM may vouch for one who can vouch for the others.

Question: Once a chapter has voted to accept the generic/standard; do they need the approval of the Worthy Grand Matron?

Answer: Review and approval is only required for changes to non- generic bylaws. Constitution Page 35 Section Bylaws: "a) Every Chapter has the inherent right to make its own bylaws, providing they do not conflict with the Constitution, Rules, and Regulations of the Grand Chapter. All such bylaws must have the approval of the Worthy Grand Matron."

Question: Pertaining to whether we should be giving **Grand Honors** to those (Past Grands) who remain on the sidelines during introductions.

Answer:

Our Constitution says: "Introductions are performed as usual. Grand Honors may be given to those entitled to receive them. (Ritual, page 97)"

→ Ritual Page 97: "Grand Honors may be given to those entitled to receive them". Red Book refers to ritual Page 17

Grand Honors are given to all those who are entitled to be escorted through the Labyrinth to the East. There are times when we do not bring Past Grands to the Altar, through the Labyrinth, to the East- especially if she or he has mobility problems. Just because they are introduced from the sidelines does not cancel their entitlement to be in the East and therefore they should still receive Grand Honors. We hope that we would not discriminate against our Sisters & Brothers that have serviced us and are entitled to receive Grand Honors; just because of their health and/or mobility issues. However, whenever possible; those 'who are able' and/or taking offices should still be escorted through the labyrinth, escorted to the East and given Grand Honors.

Easternstar-ab.ca

I was recently asked about the change from easternstar.ab.ca to easternstarab.ca and why we made this change.

This is a recap of the information I provided in Mar 2022 and at Grand Chapter 2022.

The change to **-ab**.ca has saved Grand Chapter hundreds of dollars. There are two components to the what we think of as the website: the Domain (owning/using the easternstar**-ab**.ca name) and the Hosting (a place to keep our website).

In 2022, the Domain renewal was going to be \$40 plus tax through our original service provider. We switched service providers and were able to get the Domain renewal for easternstar.ab.ca for \$15 plus tax, and the easternstar-ab.ca Domain for free.

The significant savings came with the Hosting. The Hosting was going to be approximately \$225 thru the old service provider. There are very few service providers who will support sub-domains (.ab.ca is a sub-domain). By switching to easternstar-ab.ca, we were able to get the Hosting for \$12 for the first year and \$96/year after that (plus tax). The switch to -ab.ca also allows us more flexibility in the future and the ability to shop around and find the best prices.

To ensure you are always viewing the latest information, hold down the Ctrl key and click the Refresh button (circular arrow to the left of URL). This will download a new copy of the page rather than using the cached version. This works with all website pages.

It is my pleasure on behalf of Winona to present this memorial tribute. I had known Brother Harold for over fifty-five years, it is an honor.

Harold Gulliver, PGP

"To everything there is a season; a time to be born and a time to die; a time to weep and a time to laugh; a time to mourn and a time to dance." Ecclesiastes 3: 1, 2, and 4.

We mourn the passing of our senior Past Grand Patron (fifty years) Harold Douglas Gulliver, on June 21, 2023, at the age of one hundred and four years.

Harold was born on May 20, 1919, in Stettler, Alberta area. As a farm boy he liked animals and had a special affection for dogs. His mother gave piano lessons to many students, but Harold only played at the piano. He excelled in the trumpet and was part of the local band, including playing at many musical gatherings, and in the Calgary Stampede Parade. He preferred to walk or ride a bicycle, than driving a car.

His career as a Banker began in 1937 with his first job at the Royal Bank in Didsbury, ending with his retirement in Strathmore in 1977, after serving as a Royal Bank Manager in several branches throughout Alberta. There was a break in his tenure while he served in the Royal Canadian Air Force during World War II. During that time, he met his future wife, Edna; they married after discharge in 1946.

Harold enjoyed people and his associations with them. He and Edna loved to dance, travelling many miles – even out of province – to go square-dancing; their daughter Linda often accompanied them.

In 1955 Harold joined the Masonic Lodge in Big Valley, Alberta; he was also a member of the Scottish Rite. In December 1961 he and Edna were initiated into Electa Chapter No. 10, Alix Order of the Eastern Star. Harold enjoyed sixty-two years of dedicated service to the Order, maintaining an active interest throughout that time. With his usual proficiency, he last served in 2012 and 2013 as Worthy Patron of St. Hilda Chapter No. 27 (Didsbury) at the age of ninety-four, alongside his daughter Linda as Worthy Matron.

At the Grand Chapter level in 1970 Harold was elected as Grand Sentinel; in 1971 as Associate Grand Patron and in 1972 as Worthy Grand Patron. He was also a Member of the Board of General Purposes for fifty-three years.

The 62nd Annual "Our Heritage" Session of the Grand Chapter of Alberta, was held at Medicine Hat College on June 5-7, 1973, with Sister Irene McDougall of Bow Valley No. 5 as Worthy Grand Matron and Brother Harold Gulliver of Alix No. 10 as Worthy Grand Patron. Nine hundred and ninety-four (994) delegates were in attendance at the session. That year there were 8,881 members in 107 Alberta Chapters; there were five Charter Surrenders; the Per Capita Tax was one (\$1.00) dollar; a new form of balloting was introduced – it is still in use today. As well that year on May 10, the Alberta Government passed Bill No. PR7 to incorporate the "Grand Chapter of Alberta Order of the Eastern Star and Star Homes Society". Harold was present for eighty-one (81) Official Visits of the Worthy Grand Matron, attending eleven (11) other personal visits – for a total of ninety-two (92) – during that year. His wife, Sister Edna, was his dedicated chauffeur doing the driving.

Further honors continued in 1982-1985 with Harold's appointment as General Grand Chapter Committee Member on Public Relations. As an out-going, kind and gentle man he was, who lived his Obligation, a more fitting person could not have filled that role, not been a better Ambassador for Alberta. In this capacity Harold along with Edna, and sometimes Linda, visited all eight Canadian Grand Chapter Sessions and twenty-five U.S. Sessions as well as the 38th Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Chapter in Anaheim, California, and the 39th in Seattle, Washington.

In recent times only age and failing health curtailed Harold's joy of visitations and meeting his multitude of friends on both sides of the Canadian – U.S. border.

Harold is survived by his daughter Linda Spokes (Terry) and his son Daryl-Gully Gulliver (Gerry), two grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. A family graveside service was held at Mountain View Memorial Gardens, Calgary.

Sermon: The Mystery of Light

How many of you love a good mystery?
What mystery would you like to see solved in your lifetime?

- → Who was Jack the Ripper?
- → Who built Stonehenge and why?
- → What happens to all those socks that disappear from the washer and dryer?
- → Will we EVER know who let the dogs out?

Well, these may all be unsolvable mysteries......But what about those solvable mysteries-

How many of you read Nancy Drew or Hardy Boys books when you were growing up? And how many of you are still reading books full of adventure, magic and mystery? Those mysteries by Gillian Flynn, John Grisham or J.K Rowling, and many more. For mystery lovers, there's nothing better than the feeling of discovering.

On our altar is another mystery book. In this book ... the Bible ... There is a lot of mystery. In fact, the word "mystery" or "mysteries" is used 27 times in the New Testament, and each time it is translated from the Greek word Mysterion, which has the idea of something hidden, or secret, or something that is not immediately obvious to the understanding. Generally, it refers to something that has been concealed but is now, or will be, revealed.

Now- you must be wondering what all this talk about mystery has to do with this Morning's Gospel reading. Or has any of this- to do with "light" Scientists are baffled by the mystery of light. They can study it - but still don't understand what light is. Light older than anything else in the universe. God created it first, and even to this day, light remains a mystery. Light is —

- Revealing: Every morning it removes the dark veil from the face of nature and enables us to go wherever our duty calls us.
- Light is felicitous: Who loves the darkness? Truly the light is sweet; in its presence, flowers open themselves, landscapes smile, and birds sing.
- Light is mysterious: In the morning it appears to come from the east, it travels at the rate of 90,000,000 miles in eight minutes; and in the evening seems to retire in the west.

For thousands of years it has each day visited our planet; why does it continue as fresh as on the day of its creation? For more than 2,000 years, great thinkers have struggled to understand what light is. It is a mystery.

But there is another light that is also a mystery to the human race.

God is light according to the Bible and he is as mysterious as light in the natural sense, but like scientists, we can study God and understand what light does in our lives.

Light reveals the world to us. Body and soul crave it. Light sets our biological clocks. It triggers in our brains the sensations of color.

Light feeds us, supplying energy for plants to grow. It inspires us with special effects like rainbows and sunsets. Light gives us life.

Scientists don't fully understand what light is or what it can do. They just know that it illuminates our future. Scientists tell us that light reveals the world to us. Perhaps the true God himself, reveals the real world to us!

We never see the real world until God illuminates it to us through the lenses of his word and his presence.

Psalm 119:130

The unfolding of your words gives light it imparts understanding to the simple.

Light- a mystery to the human race. In John's gospel- Jesus made it clear that He is light. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world." This statement was profound, prophetic, fulfilling, angering and comforting, and divine.

To help us wrap our minds around this, we must understand what is taking place. The Feast of Tabernacles or Booths is about to come to an end. This was one of three national feasts the Jews celebrated. It refers to the last and greatest day of the feast.

What happened on this last day of the feast and the others was that in the temple the two golden menorahs were lit, the candelabra with seven lamps and candles.

The court of the women were lit, the city would be illuminated, and from the surrounding hills the temple could be seen lit up.

The, once the candles are blown out, then darkness hung over the city.

It is in this context that Jesus says, 'I am the Light of the world; he who follows Me will not walk in the darkness, but will have Light of life"

Jesus Is the Light of the World—And so Are We

It's been said by many fathers to their kids that nothing good happens after midnight.

The dark is when people get in trouble; it's when we lose our inhibitions and caution. That's because we, as humans, were made to live in the light.

If you've ever worked the night shift, you know how difficult it is to adjust your internal clock; you have to learn how to live and even when you do, everything seems opposite of what it should be.

Jesus told His followers, "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12), and of course, He was. But why did He choose the light to compare Himself to?

A lot of reasons, but maybe the most important involves the purpose of light.

In that day and time, light wasn't meant to decorate a house; no one had a lamp sitting around just because it looked pretty.

Light was about utility and work; it existed in a limited supply, and it was important that a person make the most of the time they had while the light was still shining.

That's because in the light, we can truly see and can know the true nature of what's before us.

When a lamp is lit in a darkened room, there is immediately clarity there.

Without the light, there is mystery, apprehension, and fear; you can't truly identify where or what anything is.

But with light comes revelation—the light reveals the true nature of what is and what is not.

It shows you that a chair is not a bed and the monster knocking on the window is just the rain.

Light reveals. It shows us the truth about what otherwise exists in darkness. That's exactly what Jesus did.

He exposed a lot of things that had been in the dark for a long time.

He shined the light on the hypocrisy of the religious leaders of the day.

He refused to accept half-hearted devotion to becoming a true follower of God. He called sin "sin" and He extended love and truth with His whole self.

But Jesus not only called Himself the light of the world; He passed the responsibility of lighting the world to His followers:

You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden.

No one, after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house.

In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.(Matt. 5:14-16).

Like Him, His followers are meant to light the world and to light it brightly.

The light that brings the truth, but the truth is not always easy.

That's the difficult part about being the light of the world; it means that we must stand for truth even when we are pressured not to.

But our light is not meant to be muted; it's meant to be put on a stand or a hill and displayed.

No matter how far from the light we might be, we can still see it in the distance.

Just as He is the light of the world, so also may the light shine out in the increasingly darkened world of our day.

Martha on her darkest days, suffering with grief over the loss of her beloved brother-still looks to Jesus. She hurries to him, foregoing a greeting, she says—rather bluntly and perhaps a bit accusingly—"Lord, if you had been here, my brother might not have died" Jesus in his own grief over the loss of his friends softens his heart with love and compassion towards Martha and he honors her with the statement "I am the resurrection and the life," and then he challenges her, "Do you believe this? Without hesitation, Martha answers: "Yes, Lord. I believe

Sisters and Brothers, this is nothing new to us.

We are all familiar with the stories and lessons of our five heroines.

From them emanates a light, reminding us that, regardless of how dark and turbulent our emotional seas may become, we need only to focus on the Spiritual Light within us.

The golden beams from the star, when rightly understood, should so shine in our everyday lives that all the outside world may know the wonderful loyalty and friendships the members feel and express for each other.

When my son was fifteen (15) years of age- he was into reading The Belgariad, a series of a book fantasy epic written by David Eddings.

As a parent - it was important to me to know what my son was reading and how that might influence him. So, I began to read the books along with him.

The series tells the story of the recovery of the Orb of Aldur and the coming of age of Garion, an orphaned farm boy. Garion is accompanied by his aunt Pol and her father Belgarath as they try to fulfill an ancient prophecy that will decide the fate of the universe. Along the way, "instruments", or helpers, of the prophecy join their quest.

Garion gradually begins to learn that his Aunt Pol, the cook in the farm's kitchen, is much more than she seems — and that Garion himself is the heir to an ancient power.

Pursued by enemies of his family, he embarks on a quest across new lands as glimmers of his birthright begin to appear.

Along the way, he encounters strange adversaries, colorful fellow travelers, and the deepening realization that his destiny is both noble and terrifying.

We spent quiet times together reading the books and then we would stop and have long conversations over the meaning of each book. Even though these were only books of fantasy it made me think of this morning's gospel reading.

A reminder that we all have a quest- to follow the light of the world and only there will we know what and who we were meant to be.

Like Garion- we are not alone. We travel with each other; we encounter others along the way.

The light shows us the way. Our Eastern Star story also reminds us of our quest.

Before we enter the doors, we are reminded "that we are a seeker of Light" and like the Three Wise Men "we are being led by that light".
